CITRUS CLUB, CHARLESTON ←

Fast becoming one of America's leading food destinations, Charleston, South Carolina, has added to its reputation with the opening of the Citrus Club. Just landed atop the midcentury landmark that is The Dewberry hotel, this eighth-floor hangout (the highest in town) offers views to the Atlantic Ocean and a far-reaching menu of global delicacies, including refreshing ceviches, Vietnamese noodle salads, tropical cocktails and indulgent American desserts. Designed in partnership with Workstead, its interiors feature watermelon leather banquettes and a terrazzo-wrapped bar, while citrus plants and neon signs of orange slices (hand-drawn by the founder John Dewberry) inject the space with whimsy. B HOTEL, BRASILIA →

Channelling a command of texture and an unerring eye for perspective, Brazilian architect Isay Weinfeld has created a rugged block of a hotel on Brasilia's Eixo Monumental stretch, investing its sandhued façade with an eye-catching sequence of irregularly-spaced square windows. Inside, he has swathed the public spaces and 306 modernist rooms with handsome dark furniture and white walls. Hit the rooftop bar and pool, bounded by a wall of traditional cobogó bricks, for views of Brasilia's skyline and blazing sunsets, and the ground-floor restaurant for a menu based on organic vegetables harvested from the hotel garden, and native ingredients such as wild cacao and baru nuts. MANHATTAN LOFT GARDENS, LONDON ←

Once, the world's more interesting hotels had as many (famous) permanent residents as they did guests. Travellers loved the idea of glimpsing Coco Chanel or Jimi Hendrix at check-in; residents loved the convenience of five-star service. With Manhattan Loft Gardens, a sleek, double-cantilever tower designed by SOM, Harry Handelsman aims to revive this grand but fading tradition in brave new east London. It contains two distinct but interrelated elements: the soonto-open 145-room Stratford hotel, and these 248 luxuriously furnished lofts apartments. Designed by Paris' Studio KO and serviced by the hotel, the lofts are aimed at those intending to remain for months, years, or maybe forever.
