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

Background

As it doesn't mind telling you, this is the only hotel in Florence set directly on the Arno. Still, it's by no means an unfair brag: locations don't get any better than this gleefully unsnooty, Salvatore Ferragamo-owned riverside sleepover, just a few metres away from the Ponte Vecchio (yes, the bridge). Channelling Florentine interior-design grandee Michele Bonan's smart, bluewhite, neo-nautical chic, 40 of the 65 rooms here have bridge views and are well worth the markup (especially the terraced upgrade). Breakfast, right by the river,

is doubly good, as are the Tuscan culinary creations of Claudio Mengoni at Michelin-gilded restaurant Borgo San Jacopo. Even if you're not staying, you can get in on the afternoon-evening cocktail-hour buzz at the old-world but unfusty, Gatsby-esque Picteau Lounge that has an outdoor terrace – yes, you got it – right on the Arno.

The USP

For Florence first-timers looking for a luxe, high-romance pied a terre with walkable access to the city's top sights, Hotel Lungarno has it comfortably covered.

Background

Not since the 2012 Olympics has London's E20 postcode been so buzzed-about. The latest addition to the skyline? Double-cantilevered, 42-floor skyscraper Manhattan Loft Gardens, designed by the same architects as the Burj Khalifa. It's the latest project from hospitality king-maker Harry Handelsman (founder of celeb-magnet Chiltern Firehouse), who seeks to create a "vertical community" by integrating a five-star hotel, The Stratford, with 248 lavish serviced apartments, a private members club and social "happenings", from film screenings to

yoga in three wildflowerfilled "sky gardens". The
building's restaurant teams
have serious pedigree:
Soho House alumnus Ben
Harrington heads all-day
dining at The Brasserie,
while sister restaurant
Allegra's interiors are by the
design duo behind NOMA.
Incredible city views as
standard. With the V&A
and Sadler's Wells building
outposts nearby, this is
definitely an area on the up.
